#### BRICKS 4 KIDZ

"We're all about ensuring the children have the best fun and creativity at Bricks4Kidz... Prepare for amazing imaginations! "

Every class starts off with a LEARNING experience, followed by the BUILDING challenge, and then children are encouraged to apply their creativity through PLAYING. A typical 1-hour class follows an outline of a 10-15 minutes lesson, 20-30 minutes of building, and the final 10-15 minutes for free play.

Our one hour classes explore architecture, engineering and technology concepts using LEGO® bricks. Students participate in sessions focused on exciting themes including Space, Inventions, Famous Buildings, and Natural Disasters.

#### HOT WEATHER

We have no plans to close school on Monday or Tuesday, when extreme temperatures are forecast, and would only do so if advised to by appropriate agencies, or had significant staffing concerns. Should the forecasted temperatures materialise, children will be kept inside, given plenty of water, and staff would adjust classroom activities as necessary. Attendance in school is absolutely paramount, even more so, given the last couple of years, and children should only ever not attend school where there is a valid (usually health related) reason not to do so. Please do let staff know if parents / carers have specific concerns in relation to their child (eg due to a heat related medical condition such as asthma).



#### DOGS ON THE SCHOOL DRIVE

We had a report a few weeks ago that a parent was bitten by a dog on the way into school. The dog belonged to another parent. If you do bring your dog to school in the morning or after school, please take care that it is supervised when children are around.

#### **REPORTING ARRANGEMENTS**

You will be receiving your child's report on Friday 22nd July. Their exercise books will follow on Monday 25th July. We are required to keep some books as samples until the end of the autumn term. Your child's class teacher will communicate with you whether this includes your child. We will return the books we keep to you at Christmas. Please can you send a carrier bag in on the 25th so that children can carry their books home.





#### PARENT/ CARER CODE OF CONDUCT

Recently, I have been made aware of one of two incidences of concern in relation to parent / carer conduct. These have also included inaccurate posts and comments made on social media sites and messaging platforms. Sadly, such comments do not support the work of the school community, and can result in inaccurate and negative information and rumours circulating. I would always ask parents to get in touch whenever they have any concerns.

The parent's code of conduct states the following:

#### **Inappropriate use of Social Network Sites**

#### **Social Media**

Social media platforms are being used increasingly to post negative and defamatory comments about schools, head teachers, school staff, and other parents/pupils. St Wilfrid's Primary School considers the use of social media platforms in this way as unacceptable and not in the best interests of the children or the wider school community.

Any concerns parents / carers may have should be made through the appropriate channels, so they can be dealt with fairly and effectively for all concerned.

Where parents / carers do post comments it considers defamatory or inappropriate, the school will investigate such posts, and, if appropriate, ask for the post to be removed.

The school will consider reporting such posts to the appropriate 'report abuse' section of any site, and will consider taking legal action and reporting such posts to the police where necessary.

Examples of online activity considered inappropriate:

- Identifying or posting images/videos of children
- Abusive or personal comments about staff, governors, children or other parents
- Posting defamatory or libellous comments
- Emails circulated or sent directly with abusive or personal comments about staff or children
- Using social media to publicly challenge school policies or discuss issues about individual children or members of staff
