cross stitch - A stitch that forms the shape of a cross.



blanket stitch - A line of stitching that hooks over the edge of material.

Types of Stitches back stitch -

running stitch - a simple line of evenly-spaced stitches that go straight along the fabric without overlapping.

Overlapping stitches.

design - a plan or outline showing how something is to be built or carried out.

fastening - Ways of joining or closing, for example buttons, poppers, hookand-eye.

hem - Folding back and stitching down the edge of

needle - A thin piece of metal with a point at one end and a hole at the other, through which a piece

pattern - A template from which the parts of a product are traced onto woven or knitted fabrics before being cut out and put together.

pins - A thin piece of metal with a point at one end, used temporarily to hold pieces of fabric together.

seam - The line where two pieces of fabric are joined together with stitching.

stitch - A loop of thread to join pieces of fabric. tape measure - A length of thin flexible material for measuring.

thread (noun) - A long, thin strand of cotton, nylon or other fibres.
