
There will be optional indoor board games during some of the lunchtimes. We will remind children of the 5 steps to wellbeing throughout the week and make links with these and our everyday learning.

COURTEOUS PARKING

Shortly before Christmas, we received a call from a local resident who was incredibly upset that an ambulance wasn't able to access their property due to a car parked opposite preventing the ambulance from getting off the drive once it was on. We have made several appeals to our parents to walk where possible to school to drop off and collect your children. Unfortunately, we still continue to receive emails and phone calls of this nature telling us that parents have blocked drives or parked at local businesses which they are not authorised to.

We have an agreement with The Admiral Rodney pub which allows parents to park and walk the short distance to the school. We do not have any other agreements with local businesses. The main road at the bottom of the school drive is narrow and due to parked cars in this area, it reduces the road to one lane for a section. Add a bus to the mix and it can be chaos. Therefore, we ask you once again to consider if you do need to use your car for the school run. If you do, please can you consider parking away from school.

I really don't want to report to parents that a child has been knocked over outside school. This has happened to me previously and it was devastating to staff, parents and children.

Foundation:

We have started our new People who help us topic with a visit from Arnold Fire Station. We loved looking at the fire engine and

all the equipment they use and found out lots about what fire fighters do. We also looked at their protective clothes and learnt

about different ways of staying safe. This week we had a visit from Sergeant Roper. It was a jam-packed visit: sitting in the police car, pressing the 999 button to turn the lights on, trying out the leg straps and wearing the different helmets, all of which the children loved. Our next visit is from the ambulance service.





Year 4Over this half term, Year 4 have been experimenting how to turn solids into liquids and back again in our science. We have loved the investigations!

Year 2 have been working with Miss Knight to learn the traditional fan dance. They have worked so hard to make their movements in synchronicity and with grace and elegance!




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Year 6

We have begun to work on descriptive writing in English using the book Viking Boy. We have been magpie-ing great vocabulary in order to write a description of a Viking town as well as exploring using the text to find out more about key character. In maths so far this term we have had great fun working on ratio and proportion - especially scaling up shapes and solving recipe related reasoning problems. In addition to our curriculum learning we have begun to work collaboratively on a large (scaled - up from those maths lessons!) piece of art to go in the school hall based on Jesus calming the storm.

Year 5

Year 5 have have really enjoyed reading Macbeth and creating bias journalistic reports on the murder of King Duncan. The children have also had good fun role playing different characters.
