Key Knowledge

- Christians believe Jesus challenges everyone about how to live – he sets the example for loving God and your neighbour; putting others first.
- Jesus shows love and forgiveness to unlikely people
- Christians try to be like Jesus – they want to know him better
- Christians try to put Jesus' teaching and example into practice in lots of ways, from church worship to social justice.
- Jesus healing a leper (Mark 1:40–44) and the story of the calling of the first disciples (Matthew 4:18–19) are both Gospel stories that show Christians how Jesus wants them to live their lives.



The story of the calling of the first disciples (Matthew 4:18–19) shows Christians that Jesus wants them to pass on the good news of the gospel and share Jesus love through kindness and fellowship.



The story of Jesus healing a leper (Mark 1:40–44) reminds Christians that they should care for everyone, especially outcasts that have been shunned by society.



Vocabulary

Christian: A person who believes in and follows the teachings of Jesus Christ.

Disciples: Someone who believes in and follows the teachings of Jesus Christ.

Fisher of people: Term given to Jesus' disciples when Jesus wanted them to share their faith and find more people to follow him.

God: Fundamental to Christian belief is the existence of God, Father, Son and **Holy Spirit:** Christians believe that God is all powerful, all knowing and eternal.

Gospel: Part of the Bible that contains the teachings of Jesus Christ and the story of his life.

Heal: To cure somebody or something from an illness or injury.

Jesus: The Son of God (God incarnate)—his life and teachings form the basis of Christianity.

Leper: Somebody affected with leprosy (a tropical skin and nerve disease).

Outcast: Somebody who has been rejected by a group or by society.
