As the courses are FULLY FUNDED through our AEB budget there are no costs whatsoever to the employer, or the Learner. Learners can complete as many courses as they want, and they will receive a nationally recognised certificate from the Awarding Body upon completion of the course(s).

Places are allocated on a first come, first served basis. Our funding expires in July; therefore, we are encouraging everyone to access the training as soon as possible to avoid disappointment. We cannot guarantee that we will secure further funding to offer the courses beyond this date.




