English

Children will begin the term by researching and preparing to write their own diary recount from the perspective of a soldier, at the time of the Roman invasion of Britain in 43 AD. Then we will be studying the Roman legend of Romulus and Remus, and the children will be writing their own narrative story inspired by this famous tale.

History

We will be focussing on the Roman invasion of Britain. Why did Julius Ceaser fail? How did Emperor Claudius succeed? And children will be working to answer the question 'How successful was the of Roman invasion Britain?' This will be by supported a trip to Southall Minster for a Romans day next halt-term.



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Maths

We will be continuing our work on multiplication and division. Once this unit is complete, we are moving onto length and perimeter. We will also be working on fractions across both half-terms.

Science

Following on from the variety of work children did on the water cycle, and water's different physical states last year. Children will be continuing this work by looking at a wide range of states of matter in their Science lessons.

RE

After the fantastic work year 4 produced on the Trinity and incarnation last term, we are moving onto the topic of 'Life as a Journey.' Where we will be looking at how different religions celebrate and signify important life events. As well as learning about humanism and considering what a soul is?

Computing

Children will continue their Year 3 work on scratch, learning more about the coding process.

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Art

Year 4 are a creative bunch. It is great to welcome art back to the curriculum. This term we will be focussing on exploring still life and the work of Paul Cézanne. Children will be creating a still life final piece, using the technique of collage.



During the AREP sessions we will be discussing racism, I understand that this may be a challenging topic for some people, therefore feel free to contact me if you would like to know more about what we will be discussing.

In RE during the topic we will be discussing death and different peoples beliefs around this topic, which I understand could be difficult for some people. Again please contact me if you would like to know more about what we will be discussing. PE

Children will be completing circuit training with me. Alongside a basketball session each week with Mr. Divvevo.
