Year 1 have been investigating moving parts in books for their Design & Technology project. The class then shared their finished books with Foundation Stage children who loved playing with them. As part of the project, the children has to design a mechanism for their book which either slid from side to side or up and down. After they completed their work, they had to evaluate what went well and what they would change.



Year 3 have been looking at shape poetry as part of their English lessons. To inspire us, we went outside an did a sensory walk around the school grounds. we had a really nice time and our poems were great as a result!




Year 5 went on their residential to PGL Caythorpe Court in November with Mrs Sisson and Miss Morton. Activities included canoeing, rock climbing, abseiling, zip wire and aeroball (to name a few). We had an excellent disco which the children (and staff) thoroughly enjoyedparticularly the dance off between Noah and Stanley! We were really well looked after and well fed. Despite the cold weather, all the children had an excellent time and represented the school incredibly well.



We have also been exploring forces in science this half term. The class have done a series of independent investigations where the children are in complete control of how they answer a question. Investigations in to gravity, air and water resistance are some of the examples of areas covered.



Year 6 have been studying the work of artist Mike Barrett this half term on the theme of 'identity'. The children used acrylic paint along with collage techniques to layer their art work. Once they had layered, they finished off using ink and pen to add definition. The results were brilliant!
