Vocabulary

Kingdom: an organised community led by a King.

Holy Spirit: (in Christianity) the third person of the Trinity; God's spirit active in the world.

Impact: a marked effect or influence.

Parables: a short story designed to illustrate or teach some truth, religious principle, or moral lesson

Symbols: images that stands for something else, especially a material object representing something abstract, that you can't see/touch.

Feast / banquet: a large celebration meal.


Priest: an ordained, specially chosen minister or person of the Church, who is allowed to perform certain rituals and ceremonies.

Tenants: a person who occupies land or property rented from a landlord.

Vineyard: a plantation of grapevines, typically producing grapes used in winemaking.

- For Christians today, across the world, being a member of the community of the Kingdom of God is both a precious gift and a challenge: living out the values of the Kingdom of God is the key challenge of being a disciple of Jesus, loving God and loving our neighbour.
- For Christians, the Kingdom of God is where God rules in human hearts and minds, lives and communities.
- The Kingdom is compared to a feast where all are invited to join in. Not everyone chooses to do so.
- Jesus' key teaching in the first three Gospels (Matthew, Mark and Luke) is that he is beginning a kingdom where God's rule of love, forgiveness and inclusion will grow.
