Each week a quality text will introduce us to different things that grow. From this text we will learn new vocabulary and make links within our provision to learn and explore new things. We also have daily topic related stories.


Personal, Social and Emotional Development



Physical Development










OUR TEXTS FOR THIS HALF TERM







Specific Areas:

Literacy

We have daily phonics lessons and read in groups 2/3 times each week.

This term we are learning to read and spell CVCC and CCVC words. We will also be working on writing sentences with increasing independence and ensuring we form our letters correctly.

Mathematics

In maths we are working on building numbers to 20, adding, subtracting and sharing numbers.

Specific Areas:

Understanding the World

As part of our topic we are thinking about the outdoors, different types of plants and what they need to grow. Each week we will have our Forest Schools sessions which will support our learning in the classroom.
