YEAR 6 VISIT HOLOCAUST CENTRE

Recently, Year 6 pupils visited the Holocaust Centre in Newark. The centre, which was established by the Smith family in the 90's, is the only museum in the country dedicated to teaching and learning the lessons from the Holocaust. As part of their visit, the children had the opportunity to speak with Hedi Argent who fled Austria during WWII with nothing but her doll Suzie in her possession.

Whilst a challenging subject to teach children, the centre deals with the subject in an incredibly sensitive way - we have no doubt the children would have gained much from their visit.

From Year 2 onwards, we have Times Tables Rocks Stars which is an online game to help children become more fluent in their multiplications. Learning times tables up to 12x12 is so important as this knowledge is a vital part of maths.

We strongly encourage children to spend 5-10 minutes a day on the game. This year, we will be printing off certificates when children reach a new 'Rock Status'. In order to earn a certificate, your child need to play on 'studio'. Certificates will be handed out during Key Stage worships on Mondays.

It is now time for your child's yearly flu nasal spray!

The free seasonal flu spray is offered to all children and young people in:

Primary School Years: Foundation 2 Year 1 Year 2 Year 3 Year 4 Year 5 Year 6

Even if your child received this last year it is recommended, they have it again this year or they won't be protected. It is more important than ever, to reduce the number of those becoming ill with flu this winter to help protect them and the NHS.



What do you need to do?

You must complete one online consent form for each of your children.
It is important every child has a completed form which states if you would like them to receive the flu vaccination spray or not.

Online consent will close at 3.00pm the working day before the session.

If you decide you want to withdraw consent you must email sais@nottshc.nhs.uk at least 24 hours before your schools session.

The nasal spray may not be suitable for some children, for more information visit www.nhs.uk/child-flu

Please note: If any of the following happen after completing this form you must contact the School Aged Immunisation Service: if your child becomes wheezy, has a bad attack of asthma, has started steroid tablets for asthma or has had this vaccination anywhere else.

How will the vaccination be given to your child?

We are a team of skilled and experienced nurses and support staff. The flu vaccination is a quick and simple spray up the nose.

Step one: The nurse places the tip of a thin plastic tube just inside the nostril.

The child can breathe normally whilst the vaccine is given.

Step two: Half of the vaccine is sprayed in one nostril.

Step three: The other half of the vaccine is sprayed into the other nostril.
