## **Animals of Africa and National Parks**

In Africa, you will find some of the largest mammals on this planet. Among them are the largest land mammal, the African elephant, the tallest mammal, the giraffe, and the fastest mammal and the cheetah.

Africa is also home to many endangered animals such as the White and Black Rhinoceros.



There are over 225 National Parks on the African continent. This is where many of the wild animals live and people are trying to protect these animals from poachers.

## The Maasai People

The Maasai have a population of about 1 million people.

The Maasai language is called Maa.

The Maasai are pastoral nomads, or traveling animal herders.

Pastoral nomads travel to find land where their animals can graze.

They live by keeping herds of animals such as cattle, goats, and sheep.

They travel with their herds from one pasture to another.

They sell or trade some of their animals, while using others for food.

Their food includes milk, butter, honey, blood, and meat.

The Maasai also sometimes eat rice, potatoes, cabbage, and mealie meal, a type of cornmeal.

The Maasai are very tall people.

The men usually carry spears.

The women wear bracelets and colorful beads around their necks.
