This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

All classes receive music lessons of at least 30 minutes per week throughout the academic year. In addition to this all classes take part in a weekly 30 minute singing assembly.

Opportunity for learning an instrument:

In Years 3 and 4 children are taught the glockenspiel.

In Years 5 and 6 children are taught the recorder.

Extra Curricular Music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

Children can enrol in one-to-one music tuition outside of taught lesson time in:

- Piano
- Keyboard
- Drums
- Ukele/guitar

Children in Key Stage 2 can join the school choir which runs weekly throughout the year.

Musical experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

Each year:

All members of Key Stage 2 participate in a Christmas Carol Concert at St. Wilfrid's Church as well as a summer musical held at the school. These events are open to parents and family members to watch.

All members of F2 and Key Stage 1 participate in a musical nativity – parents are invited to come and watch their performance.

Year 2 children participate in a Harvest worship in which there is always a musical element – parents and family members are invited to watch.

Year 5 lead a musical Easter service held in St. Wilfrid's Church – parents and family members are invited to watch.

St. Wilfrid's holds a music concert which gives children who play musical instruments in school and out of school a chance to perform – all pupils who play instruments are given the opportunity and invitations are sent out to parents.

The school choir perform at various events in the community, including: Lighting of the Village Christmas Tree, Church Autumn Fair, School Christmas Fair, Family of Schools Carol concert, Young at Heart meetings as well as participating in the end of year music concert. This year children have also been invited to perform in the Young Voices concert in Birmingham

(All these events are free to watch and be involved in with the exception of the Key Stage 2 Summer Production where a £2 ticket is required to help cover costs and Young Voices.)

In the future

This is about what the school is planning for subsequent years.

- ❑ Musicians coming into school to demonstrate.
- ❑ Provide further fresh experiences in the form of concerts, visitors, trips, choir etc for all pupils.
- ❑ Arts week to include music workshops with visiting musicians.
- ❑ Audit music resources.
- ❑ Audit teacher confidence, identifying areas for CPD.
