## Swimming Update for Key Stage 2

Starting from the next academic year, swimming lessons will no longer take place for Years 3 and 4. Following a review of our provision, we believe it is more beneficial for children to take part in swimming lessons in Year 5. This ensures they have two full years to meet the expected swimming requirements and are assessed at a more appropriate stage, rather than two years early.

As the Year 5 cohort for 2025/26 has already received lessons in earlier years, we will instead be offering top-up sessions for children entering Years 5 and 6 who have not yet met the expected standard by the end of Key Stage 2. Parents of these children will be contacted directly with further information. Children going into Year 6 have been selected based on swimming data gathered during their time in Years 3 or 4; it may be that, following an initial assessment, they will not need to complete the full course.

Moving forward, this updated structure will continue each year, with swimming lessons taking place in the Autumn Term for Year 5 (and top-ups for Year 6 as needed). This year, sessions will begin on Thursday 11th September and will run for 9 weeks, from 1:30 to 2:15pm.
