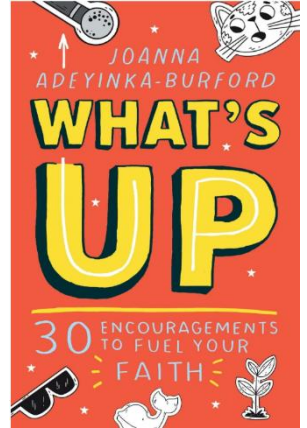

Supporting Team Ted – Big Walk 2026



I had the privilege of teaching Ted's older brothers during their time at Sir John Sherbrooke. Their family is now taking on an incredible challenge in Ted's memory: The Little Ted Foundation Big Walk 2026. From 5th-9th April 2026, Team Ted will walk 135 miles between the two hospitals that cared for Ted, raising funds to support families facing childhood serious illness and bereavement. The Little Ted Foundation provides much-needed financial help and restorative breaks for families during unimaginably difficult times. Team Ted – Whole School Walking Challenge

In the week before Team Ted begin their 135-mile walk from QMC Hospital to Great Ormond Street, our pupils will work together to match that distance by completing **135 laps of the school field**. Across the week, each class will complete around **19 laps**, which is approximately **4 laps per day, per class**.

This challenge is a wonderful opportunity to promote physical activity, teamwork and kindness, while helping to raise money for a charity that supports families with critically ill children and those who have experienced bereavement.
